



Firebreak Maintenance

There is simply not enough funding for city crews to treat every firebreak area every year. The city has done a great job in Scripps Ranch in the past two years removing volatile underbrush.

"Who owns the property behind my fence?" It might be the city, your neighbor, a homeowners association, or you! If you are uncertain, we can help. We have maps of Scripps Ranch that show who owns open spaces. Send us an email, with an address, and we will send you a map of your neighborhood.

Most homeowners know their best defense against wildfires is a 100-foot firebreak--and will do the work.

If your firebreak is city property, call 619-533-6726 for a Right of Entry.

If it is HOA property, contact them.

If it is your neighbor's and he or she will not take care of it, call 619-533-4444 to report the fire hazard.

If it is your property, do it while the soon-to-be-hazardous vegetation is easy and less expensive to remove.
